RESPONDING TO CONCERNS

POLICY

The Rainy River District School Board will address concerns in a timely, respectful, and equitable manner.

RATIONALE

The Rainy River District School Board is committed to developing and maintaining open and positive relationships with parents/guardians, students, and the community.

IMPLEMENTATION

In accordance with Procedure 2.07, Responding to Concerns

GUIDELINES

- 1.1 Individual questions, concerns, and complaints are resolved most effectively through direct communication with those closest to the point of concern.
- 1.2 The Board must comply with all relevant legislation as it relates to privacy and confidentiality for all members of the school community.
- 1.3 Where a parent/guardian has a concern about their child's classroom or program, they shall address the concern with the child's teacher at a mutually convenient time.
 - If the parent/guardian and the teacher are not able to resolve the concern, the concern shall be discussed with the school principal or designate.
 - If the concern is still unresolved, the parent/guardian shall contact the school superintendent.
 - If the concern is not resolved at this level, then the parent/guardian shall contact the Director of Education.
- 1.4 Trustees are advocates for the system and of the process to resolve concerns. Parents/guardians may contact trustees at any time, and trustees will assist by directing the individual to the appropriate staff member.
- 1.5 School councils are advocates of the schools and advise principals on matters such as the programming and code of conduct. School councils will not act or advise on individual

parent/guardian-teacher-student issues, and instead must refer these matters to the school principal.
