CALL TO ORDER

Chair Dianne McCormack called the meeting to order.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

The agenda for the June 7, 2016 Regular Board meeting was approved. (resolution #215)

OATH OF OFFICE

The Declaration and Oath were administered to William Winidgo, Trustee. Chair McCormack welcomed Trustee Windigo to the Board.

IN-CAMERA SESSION

The Board met In Camera, in Committee of the Whole Board, to consider confirmation of Committee of the Whole minutes for the Special Board meeting held May 19, 2016. Board members also met to discuss Non Union Terms and Conditions, OSSTF negotiations and personnel. (resolution #216)

RISE AND REPORT

The Board did rise and report from the In Camera, Committee of the Whole session to approve the minutes of the Committee of the Whole, In Camera Session meeting held May 19, 2016. (resolution #218) The Board also approved the amendments to the “General Terms and Conditions of Employment for Non-Union Employees”. (resolution #219)

SILENT REFLECTION

The Chair called for a moment of silent reflection.

CONFLICT OF INTEREST

There was no conflict of interest declared.

RECOGNITION OF EXCELLENCE

Employee Recognition

Ann Cox, Manager, Human Resources, recognized retirees Debbie Black, Rebecca Woods, Rose Kreger, Laura Armistead, Kathy Pruys, Dan Mack and Lucinda Meyers, for their contributions to the Board. Employees were unable to attend the meeting to receive their recognition awards due to the current labour sanction activities; however, they have been invited to attend the annual retiree’s breakfast celebration on June 15, 2016.

Bus Driver Award

Director Heather Campbell noted that Jack Medwechuk is the recipient of the Bus Driver of the Year Award. Jack has been a bus driver for forty years and will be retiring this year. The Director shared comments from Jim Chorney, Principal, Rainy River High School and Lucinda Meyers, Principal, Riverview/McCrosson-Tovell. Mr. Medwechuk will receive his award from the Transportation Department staff.

Community Partner Award

Director Heather Campbell spoke about the important role of Community Partners. Anita Lyons was selected as one of the recipients of the 2016 Community Partner award. Anita Lyons works for the Northwestern Health Unit in Atikokan. Anita was nominated by Beth Fairfield, Principal, Atikokan High School and Jody Labossiere, Principal, North Star Community School. The Director shared comments regarding the numerous initiatives Anita promotes in both schools. The award will be presented to Anita by Beth Fairfield at the Atikokan High School.

Tracy Jensen of the United Native Friendship Centre, who was selected as one of the recipients of the 2016 Community Partner Award. Tracy was nominated by Kellie Whalen, School Attendance Counsellor, Fort Frances High School, for the work she does to support students in the United Native Friendship Centre Alternative Program. Tracy will be presented with her award at a future committee meeting.

Cathy Tysz and Tim Spence from NCDS have been supporting students in the Supervised Alternative Learning (SAL) program. Kellie Whalen, School Attendance Counsellor, Fort Frances High School nominated them for the 2016 Community Partner Award. Director Heather Campbell spoke to the work they have done with the Youth Employment Fund and the Youth Job Connection Programs. The Director introduced Cathy Tysz and Nikki Paddock, Executive Director of NCDS, who attended on behalf of Tim Spence.

Chair Dianne McCormack presented Cathy and Nikki with certificates and gifts and thanked them for their partnership and for supporting students.

Vice-Chair Lewis thanked Student Trustee, McKenna Begin for attending the Finance and Policy meetings on May 31, 2016.

Ontario Public School Boards' Association (OPSBA)

Trustee McBride advised that the Annual General Meeting will be held June 9 – 11, 2016. The Director and trustees Raymond Roy, David Kircher and Chair Dianne McCormack will be attending.

Student Trustee Report

The Student Senate met at the Education Centre on Friday June 3, 2016. Chloe Machura, the incoming 2016-2017 Student Trustee from Atikokan High School, also attended.

Representatives shared highlights from the past year.

For Fort Frances High School, highlights included Homecoming Week, the first semi-formal of the year, the Valentine's Day Cupid's Café, and the Mini We Day.

For SCAP, the presentation by Natalie Panek was a highlight, along with the Rainy River High School production of Cinderella. Jesse also reported that the ongoing Buddy Days were enjoyed by all students at SCAP. Other highlights included the 30 Hour Famine, School Cleanup Day, and Grandparents' Day.

Chloe Machura reported on behalf of Atikokan High School that the Amazing Race Day, an annual event, was a highlight for the school.

The recent Celebration of Inclusive Schools was also discussed. All students who attended felt that the day was a success, with students learning a great deal from the keynote speakers.

The Student Senate reviewed the current Student Senate section of the Board website and recommended changes and additions.

Heather Campbell, Director of Education, explained to the Student Senate that due to labor sanctions, the review of the Code of Conduct has been delayed. The hope is that this review will take place in the fall of 2016, so that all staff, students, parents/guardians, and the communities that the Board serves can be involved in the review.

The Student Senate reviewed the current copy and the draft student consultation questions, with Senate members providing feedback on the present Code of Conduct, as well as the wording of the draft consultation questions. The Student Senate had recommended that the Code of Conduct use only gender neutral pronouns; as such, this change will be made this summer, in advance of the Code of Conduct review.

McKenna Begin spoke about how this is an especially stressful time of year for students, with EQAO and final examinations. As well, the one day strikes have compounded stress for many students as they have less and less time to have support from teachers and review of their learning before examinations. Students discussed possible strategies to support student well-being.

The Student Senate provided some feedback on how to support students within an eLearning environment.

In addition, Student Senate members spoke about the increase in devices and use of technology within classrooms, noting that building teacher capacity in the use of technology in instruction and assessment is a continued need across the system.

School Updates for May:

Atikokan High School

Students in the Outers Program are preparing for the upcoming 12 day trip. Students enjoyed the Amazing Race Day which featured various competitions.

Fort Frances High School

The Student Leadership Council has struggled with the teacher one day strikes: the spring semi-formal was cancelled and the 30 Hour Famine and We Are Silent days were also cancelled. The GSA had tried on several occasions to visit the Robert Moore School GSA and

the J. W. Walker School GSA but as the strike days occurred on those tentatively planned days, the GSA has not pursued further dates.

There will be a Pride Parade in the atrium at Fort Frances High School in June.

SCAP

The SCAP Student Leadership Council had a very successful 30 Hour Famine. During Education Week, the Program had Grandparents' Day and a school cleanup day.

As this was McKenna Begin's last Board meeting as the Student Trustee, Director Heather Campbell thanked her for her leadership and passion for student well-being. Director Campbell presented McKenna with an appreciation gift and wished her well in her future studies. Chair Dianne McCormack and Vice-Chair Michael Lewis also thanked McKenna for her leadership and offered well wishes for the future.

The Student Trustee, McKenna Begin thanked the Trustees and Director for the wonderful opportunity and noted that she enjoyed the experience of serving as Student Trustee.

Chair Report

Chair McCormack noted some of the provincial, national and international events which our students have participated in, or will participate in the future, as follows:

- a group of students traveled to Thunder Bay to participate in the 2016 Northern Ontario Enterprise Olympics;
- a student of our Board was 1 of 60 appointed, out of 450 applicants from across the province, to the 2016-17 Minister's Student Advisory Council;
- a student received the Rainy River District School Board's Me to We trip scholarship and will be travelling to India to start helping others in a global way;
- a student travelled to Montreal to participate in the Canada wide Science Fair;
- a group of 22 Manufacturing Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM) students travelled to Rousseau, and Arctic Cat Inc. in Thief River Falls, MN and Winnipeg Manitoba to gain first-hand knowledge of manufacturing through factory tours.

Chair McCormack stated that several events also took place right here in our District and involved the participation of students and others from elsewhere across the province and the country. Chair McCormack said that she had the privilege of attending the Connected North launch at Mine Center School and the Celebration of Inclusive Schools in Fort Frances. Chair McCormack commented that they were two very different events, but both delivering quality learning opportunities and having significant impact on everyone involved. She offered her sincerest appreciation to everyone involved in coordinating the events.

Chair McCormack offered congratulations to students, staff, community partners, parents and communities for their contributions to all of the accomplishments this year. She congratulated our Grade 12 graduates and wished them much success in their futures. She also wished everyone a safe, healthy and fun filled summer.

Chair McCormack noted that the Director Performance Review Committee met and reviewed the summarized results of the Trustee surveys. The Chair provided a written report for receipt to the Trustees during In-Camera session and it was reviewed with the Trustees and Director Heather Campbell.

Comments by Trustees

Vice-Chair Michael Lewis added congratulations to three students who have shown themselves to be considered exceptional this past school year. Angie Redford won a bronze medal at the Canada Wide Science Fair, an outstanding achievement. Naomi McManaman was awarded one of the Board's Me to We Travel Scholarships, which she will use to travel to India, and Mira Donaldson has been recognized as a student leader with a keen eye for politics, by being appointed to the Minister of Education's Student Advisory Committee.

Vice-Chair Lewis noted that these are just three examples of many of the Board's students who have distinguished themselves this past school year and offered congratulations to them all.

ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS

Director's Update

Board members received a report on activities and events during the month of May. Highlights for the month of May included the following:

- On June 1st, Barbe Dennis, Principal of Mine Centre School, and Jason Jones, Ojibwe Language Coordinator, presented with the Math for Young Children team on the Math for Young Children initiative and results to OISE/University of Toronto staff and guests.
- Mine Centre Connected North launch occurred on May 5, 2016, with the Grade 6-8 students from Mine Centre School participating in a virtual visit of the Alaska Sea Life Center and displaying a shared project with West Point Grey Academy students from Vancouver. Present at the official launch were Willa Black, Vice President of Corporate Affairs, Cisco, Lindsay DuPre, TakingItGlobal, Elder Nancy Jones, and Dianne McCormack, RRDSB Chair.
- Through a partnership with Seven Generations Education Institute and Rainy River First Nations, representatives from TREC Renewable Energy Cooperative facilitated sessions for students from McCrosson-Tovell School, Riverview School, Sturgeon Creek School, Sturgeon Creek Alternative Program, Donald Young School, and Nestor Falls School, in collaboration with students from Mikinaak School and Pegamigaabo School. The sessions which occurred from May 10th to 13th educated students on renewable energy and culminated with student teams constructing their own wind turbines.
- Be Well Together, was held on May 18th at Robert Moore School. This family engagement event brought together students, their families, school and Board staff, and community partners in support of mental health and well-being.
- School councils and elementary schools have been busy this past month in hosting Family STEAM Nights as well as Early Years Play Dates.

Director Campbell acknowledged the work of all staff, in support of students, parents/guardians, trustees, and community partners. It was noted that the Board has dedicated and talented staff, who work to instruct and to support students. Relationships with parents/guardians is truly valued and supported through activities such as volunteering, being on school council, chaperoning fieldtrips, and attending school events and is greatly appreciated.

Director Campbell told trustees that it continues to be a privilege to work together with them in support of students across the District.
