UPDATE – May 24, 2016

High schools closed to Grades 9 to 12 students on May 27, 2016

As the School Board will not be able to provide a safe learning environment for students due to the strike actions of high school teachers on Friday, May 27, 2016, all instructional programs for Grades 9 to 12 will be cancelled, and all Rainy River District School Board high schools will be closed to students, with the exception of programming for Grades 7 and 8 students at Atikokan High School.

Elementary school classes and programming will continue as normal.

Additional impacts of the one-day strikes include:

- high school extra-curricular activities, field trips, school events are being either rescheduled, postponed or cancelled during the one-day walk outs, while many extended field trips are continuing.
- buses for high school students not operating.

Buses will continue their routes for elementary students only.

Community use of schools, in the evenings and on weekends, will continue as scheduled.

Rest assured that marks will be provided at the end of the school year and administration will provide the additional necessary support for graduation ceremonies to take place.

High school students are encouraged to continue their learning through self-directed study, continuing to prepare for their exams or assignments as under normal circumstances.

Thank you for your understanding during this challenging time for everyone in our system. We are committed to maintaining positive relationships with our students, parents, staff and broader community. Parents are valued partners in education, and we will provide any new information and updates as they arise.
